Energy Conservation was a top topic. The importance of good windows and a home's insulation envelope are essential for keeping energy costs down. Mark Knold, of Department of Workforce Services, warned of a possible recession in 2024, and he advised employers about the tight labor market that will make retaining staff — versus hiring and firing staff in the coming months — a bigger consideration.

RMGA BOARD BRIEFING OCTOBER 2023

Twenty-two new contractor members were recently approved for RMGA membership (see pgs 5-6); State law allows RMGA to offer continuing education to association members only.

Dave Hill, with the Utah Plumbing and Heating Contractors Association (UPHCA), spoke to the board about an UPHCA Online HVAC Tech program they hope to launch in January. UPHCA wants to utilize the RMGA Certification Study Guide and Exam as part of their course. We share a common interest in bringing more technicians to the HVACR industry, so a work group was established to discuss: (1) if/how to incorporate the RMGA Video series into the online program; (2) how to provide Canvas Certification testing at the UPHCA Campus; and (3) how online training meshes with on-the-job, Apprenticeship training. We want new technicians to understand workplace safety, and have practical hands-on experience as they enter the workforce.

The board discussed the 2024 Education Summit and decided to keep the summit in the Fall. With Utah's adoption of most $\rightarrow \rightarrow$

→ 2021 ICC code books this year, and the Energy code expected to be adopted in 2024 with some State Legislative changes, it was decided that offering an Energy Code Class prior to July 1, 2024 (new energy code effective date), was a good idea and to provide code training at the 2024 Summit as well. We also discussed Lien Laws, and plan to ask attorney, Dana Farmer, to write a 2-part article on Lien Laws, for the *Pipeline* Newsletter, and possibly invite him to speak at the 2024 Education Summit.

MECHANICAL CODE DISCUSSION

2021 I-Code Adoption – Furnace & Water Heater Replacements + CO Detectors

AS WE CONTINUE OUR

discussions on the 2021 ICC Codes adopted in Utah this past July, we'll touch on an item in Chapter 3 in the

International Residential Code (IRC), a Chapter mechanical and plumbing contractors rarely visit. Please note in the code text below, a strikethroughindicates text removed and <u>underlining</u> indicates new text.

2021 CODE: R315.2.2 Alterations, repairs, and

additions. Where alterations, repairs or additions requiring a permit occur, the individual dwelling unit shall be equipped with carbon monoxide alarms located as required for new dwellings.

Exceptions:

- Work involving the exterior surfaces of dwellings, such as the replacement of roofing or siding, or the addition or replacement of windows or doors, or the addition of a porch or deck.
- **2.** Installation, alteration, or repairs of plumbing or mechanical systems.
- **3.** <u>Installation, alteration or</u> <u>repairs of mechanical systems</u> <u>that are **not** fuel fired.</u>

For several code cycles, the IRC has required updating smoke and carbon monoxide detection systems in a home whenever alterations, repairs,



or additions — work requiring permits occurring within a home. There are several exceptions

including work on plumbing and mechanical systems. This changes in the 2021 IRC, making an exception only to those mechanical systems which are **not** fuel fired. Please note, by definition, a water heater is a mechanical system as it has an input (gas and oxygen), a process (combustion), and an output (heated water).

Please consider the following in your gas appliance installations:

- The code for new construction requires a CO detector on every level of the home, whenever combustion appliances are installed.
- The code requires permits for mechanical appliance replacements. Some jurisdictions don't require

permits, others will issue a permit if you apply, and others actively enforce and look for you trucks.

- Some of you pull permits for every retrofit/replacement, others in specific jurisdictions, and others not at all, unless you're caught.
- In any case, the code as adopted now requires a carbon monoxide detector, on every level of the home, if not already present, whenever you install one of these as fired appliances.
- Whether you pull a permit or not, please consider installing a carbon monoxide detector with every gas space or water heating appliance if the home is not equipped with one.

The intent of this code change goes beyond the gas appliance, providing protection from car exhaust, generators, barbecue, and other devices improperly used within a garage. The detector you add for a small cost will protect occupants from CO from any source.
